PREFACE

The institutions listed in this directory own various published or manuscript materials, such as books, magazines, videos, federal and state documents, maps, theses, oral histories, National Register of Historic Places nominations forms, vertical files, local newspaper clippings, and business ledgers. This directory was not meant to be a tourist guide to the Route 66 sites to see and does not include collections of realia, artifacts, or 3-D materials, such as classic cars, exhibits, interactive displays, etc., unless those institutions also have research materials. Only resources in Illinois were considered. Resources outside Illinois were not included, with one exception. The directory is arranged alphabetically by the name of the town, rather than geographically, as if driving down Route 66 from Chicago to St. Louis. Contact information is given for each institution.

Dr. David Dunaway, of the University of New Mexico, created the predecessor to this guide when he canvassed Illinois for the National Park Service in the mid-2000s in the quest to determine which institution would be designated the Route 66 Archives and Research Collaboration center for Illinois. Use of his topic list and headings seemed appropriate in order to make the best use of limited time for this project.

All of the institutions in his database were contacted by e-mail in 2012, as were all public libraries in towns along Route 66. Many high school, special, and academic libraries, county historical societies, museums, archives, and a few other institutions in towns along Route 66 were invited by e-mail to provide input. Minimal telephone follow-up was done. A concerted effort to contact institutions statewide was not made, but one town not on Route 66 with an institution holding a significant collection is included. Several Route 66 experts were also asked for input. However, this directory should still be considered only preliminary.
